# 3. What Does This Policy Cover?

We will respond to your subject access request within **27 days** and, in any case, not more than one month of receiving it. Normally, we aim to provide a complete response, including a copy of your personal data within that time. In some cases, however, particularly if your request is more complex, more time may be required up to a maximum of three months from the date we receive your request. You will be kept fully informed of our progress.

### 14. How Do You Use Cookies?

Before Cookies are placed on your computer or device, you will be shown a popup requesting your consent to set those Cookies.
